
Q2 What is your gender identity?


Q3 What is your age group?


Q4 Which level best describes your household income during the past year?


Q5 What best describes your situation? (children / grandchildren)







Q6 How do you rate the quality of life in Pomfret?





Q7 How do you rate Pomfret as a place to raise children?










Q11 Pomfret Public Library


Q12 Recreation Programs/Rec. park fields

Q13 Social services (food and fuel bank)







Q16 Building / Land Use Offices




Q17 Bulky Waste




