INLAND WETLANDS & WATERCOURSES COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING MINUTES WEDNESDAY, JUNE 1, 2016 @ 7:00 P.M. POMFRET SENIOR CENTER

- I. OPEN REGULAR MEETING: John Folsom opened the meeting at 7:00 pm.
- II. ROLL CALL: Present John Folsom, Chairman; Paul Safin, Member Joseph Stoddard, Member; William Gould, Member; and John Bergendahl, Alternate. Staff: Ryan Brais, WEO; and Jamie Rabbitt, Designated Agent.

Absent: David St. Martin, Vice Chairman; James Rowley, Secretary; and Nancy McMerriman, Member.

- III. SEAT AN ALTERNATE AS NEEDED: J. Bergendahl was seated for J. Rowley
- IV. ITEMS TO BE ADDED TO AGENDA: none
- V. PENDING APPLICATIONS: none
- VI. CITIZEN'S COMMENTS: none

VII. NEW APPLICATIONS:

A. Alex Jezerski, Jr., 61 Wade Road, construct new home. Mr. Jezerski was present. Jamie Spoke stating the lot is just northeast of Sharpe Hill and abuts the Hampton town line; therefore we need to notify the Town of Hampton about this application. The driveway is roughed in almost to the house site (box culvert in stream channel). The applicant is going to construct a barn with a 2nd floor residential unit; eventually he will build a house down the line. Jamie said he's not been on the site for about 5 years. P Safin asked in the utilities would be above or below ground. Mr. Jezerski said that the power poles are already in place. Jamie will review notes and possibly take a site walk with the applicant.

At this point in the meeting, J. Folsom said he's like to go to Prior Applications with Conditions, as Roger Daigle was present and wanted to speak with the commission. P. Safin made a motion to do so. J. Bergendahl seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously.

Mr. Daigle spoke regarding the bridge project. He also mentioned that his funds have not been released and the caveat is still on his land record. J. Folsom said we should release the entire amount and then bill Mr. Daigle for inspection fees. J. Bergendahl made the motion to do so. It was seconded by W. Gould and approved unanimously. Jamie spoke and said that his last visit to the site was on 4/8/16 and he then showed the commission members photos he had taken of the grass growing on Mr. Daigle's property. Mr. Daigle then mentioned that he is confused as to why he has to contact the commission before cutting any trees down, yet his neighbor cut over 50 down and also put a dam in the stream. Jamie has spoken with Mr. Lane to remove the pipe he put in and replace it with barbed wire. Eventually, Mr. Lane will need to apply to the commission to armor his side of the stream. At this point, we continued with our agenda order of VII-B.

B. Town of Pomfret, 5 Haven Road, installation of forced main associated with Pomfret sewer project with temporary disturbance to wetlands. Jamie is aware of the sewer project. He spoke of the places it will run from Rectory School all the way to under Mashamoquet Brook. There will be pump stations at Rectory School, Pomfret School, the Airline Trail, Mashamoguet Brook, and Loos. J. Folsom said that he feels that there are only parts of this the commission should be permitting. The commission looked at the maps for Project #1. Jamie pointed out where the line is going in and where the pump stations will be. The application for the pumping stations will be a no-fee application. J. Folsom is going to make some phone calls regarding the line itself and what we should be permitting (lines through school properties). Jamie says we can clarify more with Weston & Sampson regarding the proposed system that does through wetlands and one watercourse. A discussion of the lines incurred and possible Public Hearing for our section of the permitting process. Not sure what the time line is for this project. John will call DEEP. Jamie thinks DEEP may have some regulatory authority over some aspects of the project, but they have no regulatory authority on Pomfret School or the Rectory School properties. P. Safin made a motion to send this application to Public Hearing due to significant impact to wetlands. J. Bergendahl seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously. The Public Hearing will be held on July 6 2016 at 7 pm at the Senior Center. Craig Baldwin needs to be notified of the Public Hearing because abutter notices will have to be sent out either by the Selectmen's office or Weston & Sampson. Clerk will place notice in paper once J. Folsom hears back from DEEP.

A. Town of Pomfret, 5 Haven Road, for sewer pump stations (no wetlands impact): this application will not be signed off on until after the Public Hearing regarding significant impact to the wetlands

 - **2. Gayle Champagne, 39 Bosworth Road**, NOV issued 5/2/14 for work within the upland review area. No new information from landowner. Still waiting to hear from Army Corps of Engineers.
