

Pomfret BOS Regular Meeting Transcript - 06/15

Welcome to our June 15. At a meeting, I'd like to open that meeting. Our first order of business is to approve the minutes from June 1 motion on that discussion corrections items change all that on favor.

Citizens comments, any citizens comments.

Now, okay, Martha we were counting on you. No, no comments.

What, no comments, I was counting on you to add on me. Oh no. Oh no no no no that's approval of minutes I wasn't there. And okay, no it's citizens comments now, do you have anything to add.

Oh, um, or is, is our resolution put on the agenda this morning. But the, it's not but I can add that.

Okay, um, or the Registrar of Voters. Okay, under items to the agenda I'll make a motion that we add the Registrar of Voters recommendation recommendation from their ad hoc committee.

Anything else.

No all payer I'm sorry, we'll add that under new business number three. Okay.

Thank you. All in favor.

Oh, our new business for we're having an open discussion with our Director of Public Works is here this morning to bring us up to date on what's happening and.

And our,

our mower is back up and running. Okay, so they were still out there taking down trees are getting pretty aggressive on the end of the month.

Probably we're doing like three days a week now.

Yeah.

I put yellow ribbon around trees on my property.

Find them now that are damaged nothing.

I didn't look at Do you think that got 20 100 yes oh something, and they're, they're big trees, and if you don't cut them as soon as they die, or either wait two or three years and when they fall down they explode, all the branches go everywhere.

You want them to stay in fact when they did. But these things, just, yeah I had a tree in my yard die and oak tree, and that's just the case, standing up, and they get dangerous so flimsy off.

So, yeah,

a week,

difficulty.

At least six

times on road which were problematic for a while I really tried to get eversource to take them down but they, they don't respond anymore.

You know, the more you customer we have to spend time picking it up. Yeah. What about the flu that does eat chips chips everything but it means all the big stuff so we have a big chip, oranges, man.

No, but you know, you get bigger and bigger right the chipping crop.

I did talk to the fire marshal about that.

And we could do a controlled burn down at the pit. But we'd have it, you know, I said it would burn for days he said you can't you can't do that. No.

You have to break it down into smaller piles and then when you do. Oh I did that once with the fire department, three weeks ago. They were worried. That's why this has been required if we want to get rid of that pile at the pit which we need to think about doing, we need to break it down somehow into smaller. The

problem we have is like, Oh, yes. People change wasn't cheap we could have.

We could have him sign a disclaimer.

No I don't think so interested in that.

I think we can be probably getting rid of whatever it is that because it's such an abundance of places to get people why a lot

of grinders when they get they have these pricing, but put it all branded into.

Could we do that with another town like collaborate with another town for having one out here for about a week or so.

I don't know if anybody was here for a week.

But you want you to want to get a little formula so it's economic has to be full time.

So,

now that we're not burning it anymore. But we think that property which seems like a good thing to do because it's there we don't do anything with it but having all that stuff

there if we couldn't get rid of it. And we want to do something else with a profit then

we got this other cleanup. I'm worried about that because we need to clean up that

property. So we'll also come in the future that how we use it or not. It's. Well, we're

cleaning that up because we are looking into that solar array of different things.

So that property does need to be gradually cleaned up because we are, that, that is

moving forward in there, there may be potential for that but there's a lot of stuff on that

site that has to be a good place to go if you pile up on the

waffle property that we purchased that would be unsafe place for right is the farm was

right. And the ones that we're bringing back now are really huge.

We're not bringing back the small stuff anymore because stately is grinding it up, we're

bringing back the really unwieldy

don't post massive I just cut them in links or something, you still can't

is any of that.

Logging people, log in, but the bill Haleakala saw logs.

I find out they discourage second saw logs from anywhere on the roads because they

can have more like the mandolin and that's material song, so they literally don't like

that. And they don't like it from farmers farmers fields, off the road of fire trees from

Uganda. So that's a disparaging tile down at the pit is huge. You see it from the front

side, it looks like oh that sounds so good but on the back. It's so I don't know if you

want to look into the tub grinder see if that works, or, you know, we start planning on

some fall burns and breaking it up into one day fine. Okay, do not want that sighs that's

not a one day burn away. Well, she said.

gonna get rid of that wood in. And we're gonna have to plan for what we're going to do

Well we thought we thought about that but then we didn't want to get into the handling of money right the fucking process. Yeah, the problem is people fail.

Right. It's a catch. Right. Well, we want to make it user friendly for residents, but businesses have a responsibility to dispose of their commercially generated tire, businesses, and you can't bring them there.

Well we talked about limiting it to four tires, what do they do and what did they do.

Just \$5 a tire is that, just give us five bucks.

Really.

Well, the problem is you know when you bring in those firefighters they're at 90 bucks a tire.

Those are really from a farm as a business. So, we turned away.

Right.

Yeah.

So our this policy that we're going to talk about today is 19 and a half inch tires maximum under that.

Okay.

All right. Good. Thank you. Today it's gonna be a great week.

got questions.

Oh, Let's see.

Professional Services. It was as well.

Yes, that's what it was.

I wanted it to be sort of ambiguous that's why I put it that way. Yes, we were not we weren't going to tell him, but now he knows.

Sorry for the delay I just sent the ask to unmute request. Okay.

Where do I change my name. There we go up here. So we've got Martha and Sue with us. Yeah, Martha you're on.

You're still muted.

Where's my video. Okay. There we are. No, that's okay. There we go. All right, could you um report back to us on the primary and elections ad hoc committee that had a meeting last Monday.

We did. We had a meeting.

We sent you a recommendation, along with some back paperwork. We also sent it to Ellie and Patrick.

And then you have a resolution I think in front of you, that we submitted to you.

Maureen, I don't have that in front of me did you email it to me I think we may have.

We gave it to you in the office, didn't we, so yeah we emailed everything. I remember you gave it to me and we made some changes to right now.

Yeah, then we email them. Okay.

Because I don't have it in front of me I'm at home.

Isn't section 10 to 39.

I know, I know exactly I'm. Let me get my other I'm looking for it right now, I can share it. Okay. Of course, of course.

So I have the copy of the statute that 10 to 39 school facilities, And then I have your.

Just the email itself which one email just okay the resolution. Perfect. Perfect. I wouldn't call it a solution, but recommend the resolution of it. I think we call it a recommendation. Oh thank you for putting it on. Okay, great.

Okay.

Do you want either of us to read it or yeah if you could, if you could read it, that would be great. Oh, do you want to read it.

Yeah. Okay, this is great having it on here otherwise I'd have to go to now, I'd have to go to my other computer, dear ad hoc committee members, thank you again for volunteering to serve on this ad hoc committee to look at possible polling places in palm fruit for the upcoming August presidential primary in November elections but it really is a such an aside, it really, we're looking. Our concern right now is August one discussions were thorough honest and informative. In the final analysis, it was determined that the Pomfret community school building best meets the requirements for the needs of the voters, especially during this COVID-19 pandemic. The committee made clear the importance of maintaining spending and hundreds to ensure the health of our poll workers electors school staff and students, the designated areas for use of bathrooms will not be open to the public, but we'll be interacting with professional cleaning companies who are certified to clean for the COVID-19 virus. We as registers will keep the public community school administration and the Board of selectmen apprised of any new information that we get from the Secretary of State's office concerning the upcoming primary and elections this recommendation report to the selectmen for the June 15 board meeting. So in Martha, and then we did attach to the Excel spreadsheet that we use with all the various buildings in town, and to statutes that are, that relate to use of facilities.

Okay, great. Thank you. Thank you for that.

zoning discussion on that you were on that meeting, this was no it was the one day I actually was sitting in meetings all day. Yeah. The only question I would have is more talked about again but I don't know why the EEOC would be number one of the school units is handicap accessible.

There's a lot of parking, the road.

I mean if I'm talking emergency emergency that would be a different situation but I mean I know too much about people walk in, I recommend having to walk long distance if they're handicapped. They would drive up to the door like they do.

I mean the parking places as well they've looked at it. I mean, the buses are parked in the lower parking lot, there's not that much parking for cars.

And so you get the buses that go on. Oh I see, okay, empty it out pocketable cars on the road coming into the big box. You can put more cars in the community school. I think the registrar's have an emergency plan for an unanticipated event, they do have an alternative location. Well they came up in a meeting with Steve he's asking that question. And I think that is a facility that would work best. The emergency. And if we don't have an emergency. It's the school. Yeah. Did you look at that as an option for an absolute, you know, burned down the school emergency.

Oh, slowly. Yeah. Right, absolutely, but that's not that's not for me. What we need to answer right now, right, because we do have an emergency plan in place, which uses the SR facility. Yes.

I think LC is responding to Steve's question about what would you do in an emergency, you brought that up in the meeting he deserves an answer at the end right you'll see well we haven't we have an emergency plan in place. If you need a copy of that we can give that to you. The first option on the emergency plan for a facility is for the first for an emergency like a hurricane or the burning, burning down would be the senior center. Okay. All right.

Just not feel right.

Um, so one of the things that we were thinking about is that emergency plan was made before.

The EFC building was made was built, right.

No, so it may be you know when this is, you know, when all this is settled, about the use for the August, emergency we can look at that emergency plan again and see what makes sense.

Okay, just to throw a monkey wrench into the whole process, we will be putting an ambulance in there starting July 1, and right. Great. kb ambulance would like to build a wall to divide that large room in half, which would make it unusable. For this purpose.

Okay, so we'll have a one to the right of the ambulance Bay. What's that, The one that's to the right of the ambulance Bay, the big biggest room there. No, not the garage, the indoor room. Huh.

The common room. Oh. Oh. So the other two, the other three areas are all garages that house buildings. Right. I mean, yes they could possibly be used.

Right. Hmm.

Going to be divided in half.

Right, but that's used during an election. Again, that's not germane to the resolution that's on the table.

table, we will look at our plan.

Due to the fact that we do have that new building so we'll look at our non COVID emergency plan, again. Okay.

So, um, we have your recommendation.

We will. We'll follow through on that and let Community School know what your recommendation is and what our recommendation is.

Yeah. Um, we have a deadline with the state that we need to have this rectified by because then once that is in play of where we can have our election, we have to do our due diligence and training and and trying to figure out the possible procedures we have to put into place as well as physical objects to put into place so the sooner that we

could have this resolved it would be greatly appreciated so we could get on with keeping everybody safe.

Okay.

You know, is this gonna come up with the next meeting or no we're gonna make today we're gonna take action today. Thank you. Appreciate it. Okay, great, anything else.

All right, thank you very much for your, your quick action on that and for your recommendation. I know you put a lot of work into it so you know in your spreadsheet i thought was great.

Yep. Thank you.

Thank you.

Take a look at this. I think, well there are two statutes that are important state statutes that that are important, that if you take a look at it kind of explains why it means.

So, and we also have a deadline that the state requires us to send in the information to them about where especially now they really want to know where the polling places are going to be.

That's a requirement.

Okay. Great.

Thank you. This paperwork, we send in.

Okay.

Great. All right. Thanks. Okay. So I think the statutes that she was referring to was one is that the primary and the election has to be in the same place and the other one is the school shall or may provide a polling place for the town citizens.

And I think that the first part of that statute if I remember correctly, your first two men and a second. Now, you provide that. So, I think, I think we should have a, an acceptance of the resolution or approval of the resolution and get back to PCs on.

This is where the August 11. As for August 11 and November November. Okay. Yeah. I'll make the motion.

I'll second that. Any discussion. No, thanks.

All of you. Great. I all set. Thank you pass that we'll pass that on to Steve Cohen.

Okay. All right. Thank you I'm gonna sign off I haven't had breakfast yet.

We haven't either we'll be here for a while.

Thank you guys. Bye.

general discussion on COVID In fact I think I went over most of those yeah we mentioned that

way back.

Yeah.

Right, that's what that's what we want to do we want to answer the questions before, but now that the 17th is fast approaching there are different openings for businesses and gatherings and things like that, face to face. Now we're not going to we haven't decided yet.

We're certainly not changing now. I mean our townhall hours will be the same. We will be 830 to five Monday Tuesday Wednesday and Thursday. We're not staying till six because we're not along the public in the building that and the red, the fire marshal the building official and zoning enforcement officer, are all handling calls and requests.

Yeah.

Making visits and answering all of those questions.

The fire marshal is very busy, not so much in profit but

the people being at home more there are a lot more people burning brush and having fires in their, in their backyards, and they're not getting stuff and they're not getting burning permits for that, I guess, actually, you should put that in the paper in front of reinforce the comments. I've seen people doing my talk to me the deer in the

headlights look, they didn't know they don't know that didn't know. No, I don't think they were trying to get around the corner just didn't didn't know. No, I had a few people that you know I went by and said you know it's like eight o'clock I said the fires are supposed to be out it out of five.

What's that all about.

Well, the problem is a little different than the fire pit in the backyard. Yeah.

Yeah.

I haven't been to the town hall yet I think Tim was there this weekend putting few more bolts on the doors.

We have a few more plexiglass shields to go up at the library as well and they're getting ready to open to the public they've made modifications in a library layout, the circulation desk around. They're doing curbside service for books and tapes.

They've got a great summer reading program going on for kids I can pick up stuff and take it home and do projects so they're, they're doing great over there I'm still, I don't have any projected date for opening this facility. Just that not no recommendations on senior centers and everybody I talked to all the other towns or they're just holding it up. type of weekly assessment. What is the state doing what can we do on an on what we want to follow and consistency among amongst policies and I think it's important to know.

They're staying phase two, they're not moving up another step yet. And it's had nothing to do with the Eastern State only Elizabeth City. Yeah, any kind of spike there nothing, and but on the other end, it's just been because of Memorial Day weekend up this way.

I'm limited in where I can go and what I can do.

It's going good about that, you know, I'd rather have that work like this. Yeah, I mean I feel for those businesses. But, yeah, yeah, it's, yeah. Well I've been pleasantly surprised the wrong. Focus on pocket of course.

Oh, well, found. Everybody's adjusted accommodated. Yeah, and the library and things that are being done department that people found it's a lot a lot of complaining really yeah I complain a lot talking to people individually about.

But that's generally the town serving the people here I think we're very fortunate to being in Windham county it's the lowest infection rate in the state, except we're the only one now that's red. But it turns out that it's because we had a 50% increase from reconfirm cases to six yeah cases. So you got those numbers, you're dead right yeah so we technically went in red for a week.

But that comes with increased testing as well. Yeah, but we enjoy it. We're the kind of gentle folks. Right. Well I used to laugh with Alan Kay Helen Hampton we are self isolation.

Yeah, yeah anyway just thinking about you.

Yeah.

Yeah, don't have much on the project updates things are moving along.

They brought in their materials to start building the buttons I haven't started that yet. the walks. Yeah, they're stored there as compensation they're bringing in the precast foundations at homes road they're starting to put those in place they sort of built a road from rights crossing road into homes road to buy those things. Yeah, so it's upgrading the airline trail already.

So they're putting those into place I would recommend well I was wondering how they were gonna get the materials in because it's at, At motor crew they're gonna drag them down, and they're gonna have a crane at the top I think to drop them in place, but at home drop dividing.

They didn't have a crane right away but

I am confident that bridges will be in place, and Holmes row, and more of those will be done River Road will not be done until next spring.

It will probably be opened up and under construction through the winter.

Probably open it excavated spray that and then depending on the season things will shut down and then we'll open that up in April.

But as

of last week.

Right. Actually, yeah, I mean they might call the I do I can't I do try to keep in touch with the people on homes road and motocross, there are some that are very concerned about it, and because it's a, it's a mile and a half dead end. Yeah, basically, but you know if anything were to happen if there was a storm or trees would come down and Bob Putnam and these people, these will be out of the resort.

Yeah. Yeah.

I mean there is an inconvenience that they have to drive a little farther.

Some folks are uncomfortable on River Road which people do speed on those roads.

As we you know right.

And that brings up the other point I forgot to chat with Bob about but they are putting these radar detection speed signs up on different roads.

A lot of positive feedback. People like going 35. Yeah.

Oh, what do you do, I thought I was going to say don't wait.

So,

what is that you're all over the place.

Oh,

I don't communicate with you. I just felt so a section that you're on, you're on the list.

So, yeah, folks really like those things so they're moving them around a little drone right now.

Yeah it does make you aware of what 25 miles an hour, is one of the roads where you actually can catch yourself. Looking at the lovely so upticks as you're driving on the side of the road now says 42. Let's back that off.

You know, you think about. Oh, I didn't have a question on your on the road there, a resident would like another stop sign.

Friendly form for a row. Is that where it is. Well, the problem is that coming. There's three, there's three roads coming together, where it where it leaves one goes through.

Well actually, you got the, you got the big farm here.

And then there's heading out towards Woodstock. Right. And then there's the four right there is the stop sign here.

Nothing. Nothing. This is the through road, so to speak. Right. Well, they don't have a stop sign I know what would be the better place to put a stop sign, well the stop sign does belong right there is one there there is one there.

Now, if you don't want to put one here because this is the through. That's friedli.

On its own is easy the nice one here are a yield.

There are yields on both of these.

But it's. I but I'm noticing more and more, you could potentially put one here at that at that corner coming from the Woodstock area for the simple fact that so many people stop there. And then leave to the person here to go ahead, who's at the stop sign and I'm constantly pointing at the stop sign for them, like you're clear, but they're very concerned because people do fly up here.

Yes, we never seen a slightly more obstructed simply because of what's going on, can we only pick up there, we can cut it back but it's actually a pretty wide open patch there there is a hole right there. Yeah, but then there's nothing here.

Maybe we need to cut back there and actually it is a it is a bit of a sweat, though swell down in there and it's, it's only a couple feet high right now, but locals know that you stop here. Yeah, but these two don't stop. It's the people coming this way, who decide to do it like NASCAR.

And go like that, instead of staying to the right, and actually making the turn, most of the traffic there most of the traffic is right in local people know. But when there's been a lot of changes because of the, the detours or other places. So that's a temporary, it's a temporary issue, but the simple putting up of two speed limit signs welcome one up on Gary school, and then one on Fridley for this one right here. And I've had people say I never knew what the town's speed limit was on the back roads, this is great if if the local residents. This is great, because now people to pay attention. And you can tell when somebody is over like 3035. Yeah, and then coming down from Gary school to Fridley for it to have the Woodstock, which we're getting a lot of now with people coming around. They're flying.

Yeah.

Yeah. Well, I mean, maybe maybe putting up a warning limited view.

I mean it's our roads we could probably do whatever we want, we could put up a sign this intersection or. Yeah, like that. My incoming traffic that's not. Yeah. Oh, now would be the one you got to put it, you'd have to put one there and want to stop here and start again that's another place for problems that, that people stop there. For now, there's so many keep worrying about this one because you really can't see. Even the back of the stop sign because the stop sign is where it belongs. Another 10 feet back. So you're really supposed to go to the stop sign, then come forward to here and actually see so it looks like you're going, and that's why these feet. But what are the drivers, right. I find that a lot of the times I get bar over 15 feet No wonder they're looking at it. Yeah, but he's all the hesitancy of people coming up this way to make the turn is tough, is tough. And I don't know about cutting this back any further because, where does their property line and Lord knows they've got a lot of materials. Yeah, they do but we can house them to Emily's, they might be okay with that because it might their site might want it but that wouldn't hurt.

It wouldn't. The farm trucks have no trouble.

They've got one right they've always got the remotes got the right.

That's right.

Yeah, I'm gonna go out there with problems, and make it a safer intersection.

Yeah.

Let's see the sidewalk update. Finally, yeah. They did got a contractor came back and replications as required by the state.

I was happy with it the way it was but they cut the asphalt and redid the concrete and put you know steeper slope asphalt, to get to handicap ramp.

It doesn't make sense, because in order to get to the handicap ramp, you have to go up a scope it's deeper than that.

Yeah. But, but it miss ADA requirements down yeah no the state rejected two of them. If allowed to weaken it make them tear it out and do it again which just.

They'd lower the concrete pad and make the defies logic.

So, we had a discussion out there and so quality of the town engineer was there and we went through it and just decided that we will accept all modifications as they are right now put an end to this torture. We want to suggest racing.

No,

thank you very much way.

Yeah, no.

Yeah. Yeah.

No, that's a lot, there's a lot of construction involved in doing that, because that is one place.

Yeah. Yes.

I was disappointed because they cut the asphalt several times and then put in little pieces of asphalt there which looks like patch 4.2 getting heavy use it Does everybody know more, but not out there just out walking and I anytime today I go through those, well, why would offer the nice is it is it working. Yes, it's working.

And the solar those solar morning wow yeah all people know what they're there for now, I mean the kids living at the schools knew what they were there for. Yeah. And the kids are now, they won't cross, except that though. I think they won't they just won't, I think they shouldn't.

Yeah, I think, at first they were so used to cross wherever they could, because it wasn't one it's like okay I've got 100 yards me beside me now. I'm 13 years old I'm just going to jet across the road. Now they know, just to walk up to the next house, there's a walking activity as low risk but, yeah, most of them. Doesn't make the place yes the way it is. Well now that the ramps are done, and accepted, especially in front of the library.

We're going to move forward on putting another crosswalk at the library. The library which is where the East sidewalk crosses over to the west sidewalk. That's the. So from the library South it's on the east side.

Some website. So there should be a crosswalk there. The state had contacted me about putting in a crosswalk at Ranger School concert school and then the town take ownership of this, and I got back to them and said, Those crosswalks are already in. I would like the state to consider swapping those two crosswalks for one at the library so they did change their recommendation for this road content so probably in the next year or two, they will have all that crosswalk every school has two crosswalks it is because they're much larger. I just don't think they knew that I was hoping you know it took. It took a year they get the permanent sidewalks and it's agonizing able to trade two for one and get the one we really need to people who are homeless.

And they don't talk to them.

It's frustrating for them and it's frustrating for anyone who has to deal with them.

And I'm wondering if the town has to accept that sewer ordinance or the WPC a, you know, I have to look at the lab.

Right, we might have that we've been in discussions with Putnam on our WPC budget for next week it's next year.

I'll talk with Brian again about that or. He's, he's a very good resource he's the Director of Public Works, Director of WPC a

cemeteries, what do we know about cemetery, anything. Yeah, which cemetery are we gonna put these memorials. Well, have the action forgot the price and I have not done that yet. Although I will, I thought is a little bit before the idea was to have, because there are, that it's very.

The, some of them have stones, no record so suggestion was the one monument in the cemetery.

That would have a nice mountain flag, a little bigger flag rather little two by four or something and then it would say something about some kind of statement that embraces the recognition for all veterans, and that would have a nice light ceremony. Now we got 13 cemeteries. Yeah, so the question is, get

obviously the two big ones the big ones. Yeah. What do we do with the big ones versus the smaller ones they do the same thing. That's.

Yeah. If the property if this topic makes sense then we have to say, I think it does because it avoids the. Personally I think it goes embarrassment,

trying to say here of ignoring someone ignoring someone posthumously that we didn't know was there. You know it does create it's sort of, it's painting with a broad brush. But it's, it's covering. Not if we put the smaller players in the victim of want to do that. Yes, but this somebody, this is the town's smoke legs.

Right now that isn't the one here that maybe address all right. Yeah, I was thinking about the money do we want to spend, what do we get for that.

Grant.

Grant, it was seven.

I don't know inexpensive, hundreds of dollars at minimum, yeah, maybe more. What about donations.

About sponsorship. We also recently funded our education outreach of enrichment.

That was

what was sponsoring.

Because I would be more than happy with any sponsor one of these approved standardized things, and having to submit.

Well, I think we need to come up with what I think we need to be consistent with what it would look like. They all need to be done by the town, so they are equal and consistent wording. Yeah.

Yeah. So part of the problem is that when we do volunteers to put up those flags and sharing ritual knowledge about the scouts this year. You're always going to miss something that's an inadvertent. This was, but it's still embarrassing. And because we didn't do the Memorial Day parade on done Piketon purchased three weeks and put them off at three of our cemeteries in sort of a little fight, right. What you think might

be some kind of agreement, look nicer. In the maybe position in the center for some iteration, walk by it.

I don't think it must be a gravestone as much as some kind of a monument that could be one of those things that lays flat on the ground and you set a wreath on it or a flag on the ground or something that was a little bit built up into the sky on one side and that way in another in some shape. And then you can see the gap, or whatever. Yeah, somehow, in the back of it have somebody come up and say veterans, and then the. Right.

So we draw attention somebody a wizard betters. Yeah, gotta stand up be tall, just want to be nice for a small flying in.

No, no, look over here.

We want to put a light version in the small cemetery, a smaller version of the smoker all the other cemeteries that are very tiny make that a little small block that maybe was laid flat or at least it was there. It was like, I think it says some of the smaller ones.

So if we didn't want to miss any one we get kind of larger ones.

Yeah. Yeah. Okay, that's good.

So I'm going to get all my wealth like that active I don't know how to get some cost on a different sized grin box manuscript into someone's letter. And, is that how long. Yeah, yeah. Okay, and then we'll have to have another discussion and think about how big you think to walk, it's the other words, in some in some words aren't big enough people have trouble reading it right and, depending on how much you want

them to say, why don't we come up with the description for it. But we want to say that we probably won't say one minute.

He may advise well you need one like this.

So the next action, and then you start editing your inscription. Yeah, based on the cost. In one word, put it on in shorthand. Thank you.

All right.

But the thing to say send it out.

Yeah.

By batching the some of the words

that people can read it without saying we want to wait and I think what it says is that times agents for the veterans Gary brown asked him to participate. Yeah, I think it'd be good to get different ideas, or

people from the dead car somewhere out there, tied up in an accident. Yeah, thank you.

Tire disposal policy which we had a bit of discussion with I think I sent out the latest version. Yeah, I like that. My only hesitation as it says quantity is greater than four our urge to contact the town hall in advance.

I think we should change the quantity is greater than four per event need to contact prior.

Are we going to ask them to pay for it, or I'm gonna ask them to throw them on the side of the road for me to pay for time. Can we change that to say you're throwing away right squash and let's just toss it over that stone.

This is why honestly when I get it when I get a new set of tires. I gladly pay the time that we're supposed to run the business.

I just pay the 10 bucks you

don't know how to do anything. This is like another discussion we had about something without t work. So maybe this is the similar thing, and then they could just give it if they make an arrangement with account agreement, they can get the check points. So, we can say that all the money go to, well he was

Winston recommended that we direct people to Empire tire in Norwich, which they would take, take them there and dispose of them.

I wrote on Plainfield,

for large tires but you know I'm afraid that if we get to this quantity issue, heavy handed on this that they will find more.

But it won't make any difference so it's also getting rid of them.

Because I was talking about you took advantage of a good nature policy.

Well, I think that we are not encouraged that beyond the beyond the limit and beyond the side need to contact us contact and arrange to make any arrangements, and we leave it appropriately back there. Let's do it on a case by case, we can just see what happens the first couple of times so

we'll be able to advise.

What we have three of bulky waste events a year so what we're seeing is, you are limited to four tires per household.

Per event so that's 12 times a year. Yeah.

Tires should change. Yeah, I think that if you're changing tires. Change should be there and limiting the noise by retreads.

So I'm going to just add in here 12 per year. Now because I forgot to show up as well.

No, no, no, just say for events for my

family per event. Yeah, because we paid a residence for the last bulky waste we had, I think we paid probably a couple thousand dollars more than we ever had. Due to the

sheer volume of bulky waste, because people were at home cleaning out the garage Well, yeah, but also we had, I think 15 or 1800 thousand times which is more than the mean that on the one hand it's good that they're bringing their but on the other hand, when you see who's bringing them in, they come in from some of them or some venture business, or some magic number I see three bulky waste.

We're gonna have a simple \$5 attack.

Okay, it's not the worst idea so do we need to adopt this as a house policy will be changing.

I'm taking the figures and I called it a policy so we'll just make that one change to must contract the townhome regarding disposal options in extra tires larger than 19 and a half inches applies greater than four but it must contact the town's advanced riparian disposal options. Okay.

I'll make a motion to approve this set of urge contact Muskaan Yeah, as presented any more.

No, all in favor. Aye. And the town will no citizens that will be a publication before the next.

And what I would do is make a single sign. And this time, you know, put the entire tire policy policy.

Notice on the web page.

Night, 17th and 18th. Right. Yeah. All right, all those dates I was one of my questions and problems. Yeah, of course. I think they can be determined before the both ways.

I'd like to see it be a hard line. Well yeah, somebody shows up with a tractor tire we're gonna say I'm sorry we can't take.

And if you don't want to put that on the, on the constables. I think we've gotten away. Recognizing that it's for residential, all the way. I think we need to reinforce that, again, that it's residential The last time I was there there was a lot of contractors.

Now, not everybody is doing that much work on their own home.

Yeah, not everybody should be asking.

Yeah, so we'll put some signs up there this time, maybe we should have a handout. When people drive through. And you did say that those, those a Swap Shop or something yeah the swap swap stuff, and things change recycling.

So either way this month.

Really, I was paying less than Apple audio.

They really don't.
